**I. PRIMARY PURPOSE AND FUNCTION**

Asian Pacific Development Center and Aurora Mental Health Center have teamed up to deliver therapeutic services targeting clients, ages 3-24, who have first/second generation refugee or immigrant backgrounds. The Trauma Resilience Youth Program (TRYP) clients are paired up with a health navigator. The health navigators will provide language interpretation, case management services and cultural understanding to support the different refugee and immigrant communities in the following languages: Spanish, Arabic, French, Sango, Swahili, Nepali, Burmese and Karen. The essential functions of the TRYP child clinician are summarized below:

**JOB RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. Perform diagnostic assessments and establish treatment goals in order to provide effective services, to refugee and immigrant children and their families.
2. Conduct individual, group and family treatment in accordance with treatment goals.
3. Comply with all paperwork requirements, including intake paperwork
4. Administer UCLA measure to all TRYP clients as required, and support navigators in their completion of NOMS and SDQ.
5. Attend team meetings, supervision, Virtual Team meetings and Advisory Board meetings.
6. Serve as consultant with mental health professionals, school systems, social services and other community agencies.

7. Provide case management services, including crisis management, advocacy, linkage, service planning, monitoring and referral, as appropriate.
8. Collaborate with psychiatrists for medications required for clients.
9. Provide wellness groups and other presentations to the community.
10. Maintain acceptable attendance record at all times.

**Other Functions:**

1. Perform other job-related duties as assigned.

- At least a master's degree in counseling psychology, social work, or other mental health field
- At least three years of experience in providing direct clinical services
- Licensed in Colorado
- Experience working with immigrants, refugees, trauma
- Ability to work well using interpreters
- Willingness to travel to schools within metro area
- Experience working with children and families
- Knowledge of systems in the U.S. and in Colorado
- Knowledge of the AAPI community in Colorado
- Ability to take direction, be flexible, and work collaboratively with multi-cultural, multi-disciplinary, multi-agency team
- Bilingual fluency is highly desirable
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
